I am always pleased to support you in your preparation for these visits and now Government Covid restrictions are lifted, will attend as many as possible.

Herts Tennis were audited in January this year through a very similar visiting process and we are proud to have been awarded the highest rating of 'Very Good'. Our sincere thanks to all our venues and your WOs for the sterling work you do in promoting and upholding the safeguarding standards that contribute towards a safe and inclusive and environment for all to play tennis.
