The improvements have been made as part of a nationwide programme of investment, refurbishing tennis courts that have deteriorated in recent times. Over 2,000 courts are receiving investment across the UK, with renovations managed and funded by the LTA and the Government. Hopefully there are several benefitting near you.

In April we were delighted to welcome our LTA County Award Winners and their guests to join us in celebrating their wonderful achievements through 2022. We also presented our County Player, Herts League and Harris Cup winner awards at a lovely dinner hosted at Harpenden Golf Club.

Amongst the very deserving winners we presented Jeff Wayne with our President's Award for his outstanding service as Men's County Team Captain, a position he has held and achieved so much with over an amazing 35 years, bringing the team from the relative depths of Division 4 to the Championship heights of Division 1 and winning us the national title no less than 7 times out of the last 17 years (summer) and 8 times (winter). #### HACRO looks to turn lives around with the help of tennis

We were absolutely delighted to award this year's Connecting Communities LTA County Award to the hugely inspirational people from HACRO.

In late 2022, HACRO began a pilot project at Bovingdon and Flaunden Tennis Club where, in partnership with Herts police, the club put on a weekly tennis session for ex-offenders as part of their rehabilitation into the community.

Once witnessed, it's impossible not to be touched by the potential life changing experience the tennis sessions at Bovingdon and the friendliness being shown by those involved offers these ex-offenders, who have had such a hard life and are desperately trying not to return to crime and instead turn their lives around.

The project, although in its infancy, has already had a dramatic impact on people who have been lucky enough to meet with those involved.

It also clearly had an impact on the panel who decided on the next level of the LTA Awards, because HACRO were recently announced as the Regional Connecting Communities Award winners. Next up is a shot at the National Award so watch this space!

The successful pilot has provided a blueprint for a wider rollout which is being developed in conjunction with Herts Tennis and the LTA. The hope is that HACRO can support the LTA in rolling out the project to other counties beyond Hertfordshire, but for now we are looking for other clubs within the county who may be keen to get involved.

#### **Supporting Tennis in Schools**

Since the last bulletin, through the Herts Tennis Foundation (HTF) and Herts Schools LTA, we have been involved in supporting lots of events in schools, helping hundreds of kids to access tennis, take their first steps in competition and thoroughly enjoy building their skills or representing their school.

Back in early May (when it was still cold and wet!) Queenswood School hosted the National Girls Schools Doubles tournament. This event, which has been running for over 100 years, saw over 80 girls from the South East and as far afield as Warwick, competing in 14U, 16U and 19U doubles events. Volunteers Bridie Amos and Tom Dyball worked alongside referee Jaimie Broomfield for the one day tournament where the eventual winners were Queenswood, Wycombe House and Sevenoaks. Staying with the secondary age group the Herts Schools LTA have been running a programme of events across the county which wrap around LTA Youth Schools structure. One of these events for years 8, 9 and 10, the Nicola Mabbitt Trophy for less experienced players, was held at Queenswood on 28th June. Boys and girls competed in 6 areas to win through to the county finals and a fantastic afternoon of tennis was had by all. Thanks to the Herts Schools LTA team of Pam Burrage, Pam Hall and Penny Kent and to the organisers in all the area events.

Tennis has been buzzing in the primary sector too with red, orange and green ball events run by the Herts Schools LTA starting in May and running until early July. Additionally tennis has been represented at the Herts School Games and the 'Tennis Compete' event for year 3 and 4 pupils was held on 27 th June at Welwyn LTC. This was a great collaboration between the Herts School Games Organisers (SGOs) and the HTF, with schools winning through their area to compete in county finals. Over 40 players took part and tennis leaders from Richard Hale School's Sports Leaders program worked hard to umpire and keep control of some very competitive mini red matches! Very many thanks to Welwyn for hosting brilliantly on their mini courts, to the HTF team of Phil Martin, Marion Stephenson, Carole Draper and Bridie Amos, and to the SGO team led expertly by Tanya Angus.

But it's not only competition. Just as importantly The HTF team led by Phil Martin has also been supporting the SGO network in Hertfordshire using funding from the LTA Open Court program to open up tennis to SEND children, running events at Gosling and Batchwood where SEND children work together alongside classmate buddies getting active and enjoying tennis activities. Tennis leaders from St Albans Girls School were brilliant in helping the younger kids tackle the activities, building their confidence and skills.

## Safeguarding and Welfare Officer Update

The LTA have improved their communications with Welfare Officers who will receive regular updates provided they have accepted marketing preferences. The first of these newsletters was distributed in April.

The Safeguarding Strategy is currently under review and County Safeguarding Officers have already had the opportunity to provide input. Welfare Officers will also be asked to complete a short survey and it is clear that there are plans underway to further recognise the importance of the role and provide additional support.

In place of a National Safeguarding Conference this year, there will be a Safeguarding Awareness Week during the first week in October with the opportunity to sign up to a number of invaluable workshops running during the day and evening on subjects to include: a safeguarding case study; venue safeguarding support visits, risk assessment process and a new interactive and immersive training experience called Izzey's Story. This has been developed by the University of Kent in conjunction with the LTA, volunteers, coaches and young people and examines the dynamics of grooming and sexual abuse. Completing this will add one year to your existing basic safeguarding training. There will also be an update on the Young Person's Welfare Ambassadors Pilot which Harpenden's Jessie Hosking is involved in.

A number of venues have recently been visited by Melissa Miller, the Regional Safeguarding Officer and all have found this invaluable in moving the safeguarding agenda forward. Several unattended visits have also taken place and Tessa Terry, our County Safeguarding Officer is always available to help venues understand the self assessment process.

We have piloted a couple of daytime Welfare Officer Networking Events in June and our grateful thanks to Welwyn and Moor Park for hosting. The next session will be an evening in September in response to your feedback; our thanks to Elliswick for offering to host and as we expect places to be limited, invites will be issued shortly and more offers to host are welcomed!

These events are proving to be an excellent way of discussing and sharing common issues in a safe space, 'It was so helpful and enjoyable meeting up with other WOs ... We had a really productive session which just went its own way ... everyone was so comfortable to share experiences and queries .. I thoroughly recommend the sessions!'

Our plan is to develop a network of local 'Clusters' that will continue the initiative with the support of the CSO and establish local WhatsApp groups, again under the coordination of the CSO so that there is safeguarding 'Expert' always on call.
