GBTW Success!

Great British Tennis Weekends prove a big hit in St. Albans.

Over 1000 people took part in Great British Tennis weekend activities across St. Albans over the summer, with the vast majority of these participating at Community venues.

Almost 400 of these participated over the weekend of 28th and 29th June, which was designated as the tennis in St. Albans weekend. The participants included the newly elected Mayor of St. Albans, Councillor Geoff Harrison, pictured below, who demonstrated some impressive tennis skills.

Both Harpenden Sports Centre and Verulamium Park ran GBTW events on all eight days and had over 600 participants across the two sites (pictured below). In addition, over 100 people, mainly families, took part in tennis activities in the indoor sports hall at Westminster Lodge Leisure Centre.





All GBTW participants who played at a community venue were given a voucher, enabling them to play tennis again for £1 at any of the community sites across the district. So far this offer has been taken up by approximately 150 people.

Following this year's success discussions are already ongoing with the site operators to make next year's GBTW events even better and to attract even larger numbers to these events.

Batchwood Sports Centre Reopens

Following the devastating fire three years ago, the new Batchwood Sports Center finally reopened its doors in May via a 'soft launch' attended by the then Mayor of St. Albans, Annie Brewster, pictured below cutting the ribbon.

Then in July this year Judy Murray (pictured on the front cover with the current Mayor of St. Albans, Cllr Geoff Harrison) was guest of honour at the official opening of the new centre. The new Batchwood sports centre includes six indoor courts, three outdoor courts and two Mini Tennis Courts along with a 48-station gym, strength and conditioning suite and a judo dojo training area and cost around 6.6 million pounds to rebuild. This was funded by a combination of grants from a number of bodies including the Council's Leisure Capital Budget, The LTA, Sport England and the insurance pay out. Herts LTA also gave a grant to support the equipping of the Coach Education room.

The new sports centre is managed by 1Life on behalf of the District Council. 2013/14 saw a larger entry than ever before and despite the rain a lot of matches were played. We have used online entry again which reduces significantly the amount of administration necessary.

Hertfordshire gained maximum points in both these areas and as I managed to sort the admin basically on time, I won County League Organiser of the year. We had a significant number of 2 player team entries in the girls and older boys age groups. In fact in some age groups we only had 2 player teams. Regrettably some clubs had failed to read the notes posted on the website and in the promotional e mail about the 2 player divisions, and had entered the wrong event. If you want a 4 player team you must enter division 1.

In terms of match completion we were third (81%) behind Buckinghamshire (84%) and Essex (83%). We can do better by

1. Not entering a team without checking that you have players available on the dates set.

2. Organising our teams sooner and rearranging dates promptly where weather has forced a rearrangement.

Teams which won their division should have received their winning pennant by now. They were sent to CMCs in August.

I am not aware of any significant changes proposed for next year. Dates will be published in late November/early December on the LTA website.

This year we have managed to extend our programme to offer two Mini Red competitions.

Teachers Course

Our season started with the annual Teachers Course at St Albans High School. The weather was unkind but we were able to get outside for most of the time. We covered drills for team players – as advertised and introduced drills for building mental strengths in team players. We were also able to adapt and provide more basic level drills and information to suit the needs of some of the non-specialist teachers. Team Tennis Schools Competition

The Team Tennis Schools competition is for Year 8 and Year 10 students and is run by the LTA through Local League Organisers. Both the Organisers for Herts are members of the Herts School Committee. The League runs in Herts, and then the winning teams' progress through to the national knockout competition. The format is teams of four, playing four singles and two doubles matches.

Boys: This year there were 29 teams in the Year 10 competition and 31 in the Year 8, an increase of 6 teams from last year. Most of the entries were in Division 1 but Division 2 is growing steadily. There were some very close matches, many decided by the new



tiebreak shootout. The county finals were held at Queenswood School on June 26th. Watford Boys won Division 1 in both Year 10 competition and Year 8. Haberdashers were runners up in both age groups. This time we were able to run the Division 2 finals alongside Division 1. Each team consisted of 4 players, and many schools rotate players to give a wider experience of competition to their players. One area runs a Division 2 League and a year 7 League as well. So maybe 800 – 900 players competed in all. Huge thanks to local Organisers – we could not run this competition without you.

32 winning teams came to Queenswood School for the County Finals on July 5th. Each team played in Round Robin boxes against the other winning teams in their age group, the boys on the clay courts and the girls on the astroturf. This new fixture format worked really well with many of the divisions having the bulk of their matches completed by July/early August. Herts 3-Pair Summer Doubles League

As most of you will know, this season the league adopted a new rule aimed at averting walkovers. The rule awards a penalty, equivalent to a win, to any team that gives a walkover. If you were to ask me after one season if the rule had been a resounding success, unfortunately I'd have to say no, it hasn't. It has penalised the teams giving walkovers of course - and in most cases that has resulted in those teams slipping down the rakings in their division and in a number of cases falling into a relegation position. However, it has so far failed to have the impact we all would have wanted and certainly I expected - of avoiding walkovers being given in the first place.

I didn't set out to fill this column talking about walkovers but it is the one matter that dominates league issues and actually, I think we've reached a defining moment in the league's future because if the new rule doesn't convince teams not to give them, nothing will.

Who are the culprits and why do they give walkovers? Surprise, surprise, it's the mens teams in the top few divisions. No change there then I hear you say. I find it absolutely crazy that three matches were not played at the very pinnacle of the mens county competition (compared to nil in the top Ladies division) and a further, and quite frankly amazing, nine by the mens teams supposedly looking to get promoted to it (those in Divisions 1A and 1B). There were two in the equivalent Ladies divisions - and I know the Ladies will be embarrassed by even that amount. Yes, in 2014 mens teams still appear to be of the view that if they think they're likely to lose, it's better to save face by not turning up. Now that is embarrassing. Surely it's time for us men to move on.

Right then, let's turn our attention to what this league is really about...yes, the tennis! There was some fantastic competition this year and what really struck me was how close-fought some of the divisions were. There were lots of examples where divisions were won by the slenderest of margins but some were almost too close to call. For example in the mens competition, Division 4B saw Harpenden 5 edge out St Albans 2 for the title by just one rubber, while in Division 6B Moor Park 3 and Harpenden 6 were separated by a mere two sets, Moor Park just coming out on top there. Over in the Ladies competition, although the record books will show that Letchworth 1 once again won the overall Ladies title by beating their main rivals, Harpenden 1, that doesn't tell the whole story. In fact the championship decider could not have been closer. Their 5-4 win included winning two 3rd set tie-breaks. Looking forward to next year's rematch already!

For the record, Barnet 1 came out on top of the overall mens competition. And for the record books I believe that's the first time they have won the competition since 1991. I wonder if anyone who played a part in them winning this year's title was involved in that title winning team 23 years ago.

Congratulations to all the divisional winners. It would be fantastic to see all of you collecting your trophies at the AGM on 4th December. Many thanks also to everybody who took part in the competition and - walkovers aside - ensured it was played in the right spirit. I am also very grateful to you for continuing to put in some very noticeable extra effort into inputting results. Thankfully last year's step up in quality was not a one-off. In fact the Ladies are now almost perfect!
